



More information about the Museum of Pontevedra

The Museum of Pontevedra, founded in 1927, consists of six buildings. You are now at the Sarmiento Building and the Castelao Building, our last major addition.

When can I visit the Museum of Pontevedra?

All year long the opening hours of the permanent collection and the temporary exhibitions are the following:

Tuesday to Saturday from 10am to 9pm.
Sundays and holidays from 11am to 2pm.

Last admission 20 minutes before closing time.

The Museum is closed on Mondays. It will be closed on January 1 and 6 and December 24, 25 and 31.

At the Fernández López Building you can visit our library, specialised in art and history subjects, where, in addition to the numerous existing literature, you can also consult our archives of documents and photographs. To access it, it is necessary to make an appointment at: museo.citaprevia.salainvestigacion@depo.gal. The opening hours of the research room are: Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 2.30pm.

How much is the entrance fee to the Museum?

Free admission to our permanent collection displays and to any temporary exhibitions.

What does the Museum of Pontevedra offer to visitors?

We recommend a stroll through the Galician art and history, from Prehistory to the latest art trends, complemented with the remarkable Spanish art from the 18th to 20th century.

The Education Department also offers several guided tours to the permanent collection as well as to the temporary exhibitions.

Manual wheelchairs are available for visitor to use.

Does the Museum of Pontevedra organise others activities?

The Museum of Pontevedra organises many activities throughout the year, some of them are organised by the Museum and others by external institutions. Exhibitions or concerts are just a few of them.
